



Recipe of the

Garlic Mashed Cauliflower

1 tablespoon olive oil clove garlic, smashed 1 tablepsoon reduced-fat cream cheese 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt 1/8 teaspoon freshly ground black

1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese pepper Place a steamer indert into a saucepan and fill with water to just below the bottom of the steamer. Bring water to a boil. Add cauliflower, cover, and steam until tender, about 10 minutes.

Meanwhile, heat olive oil in a small skillet over medium heat; cook an stir garlic until softened, about 2 minutes. Remove from heat. Transfer half the cauliflower to a food processor; cover and blend on high. Add remaining cauliflower florets, one at a time, until vegetables are creamy. Blend in garlic, Parmesan cheese, crear cheese, salt, and black pepper.
